Letter from the President

Dear Friends,

Thank you for being a part of the Clark County Food Bank community. Hunger is an “everybody thing,” and it takes all of us to help. Whether you volunteer, donate, work in one of the partner agencies, teach nutrition classes, or simply advocate kindness to others, you are part of the solution. You make the good happen in our community. 2019 was a good year for the work that we all do.

- We added 19 new food distribution sites including Community Kitchen Walnut Grove, a 2nd pantry operated by Clark County Food Bank.
- We reached over 3,000 people in the community through Nutrition Education, and began a new partnership with the Free Clinic to offer nutrition and cooking classes specific to adults living with diabetes.
- More volunteers served at the Food Bank than ever before. This means our friends, families, local businesses, and organizations are working together to impact our community and alleviate hunger.
- Local farming, especially at Heritage Farm, brought over 190,000 pounds of fresh produce into the system, run almost entirely by volunteers. Increased Food Bank Fresh distribution helped to bring it to dozens of pop-up sites around the county in the locations of greatest need.

Thank you for your commitment to this community and to the mission of alleviating hunger and its root causes. I am inspired by you and thankful each day to partner together in the work to end hunger.

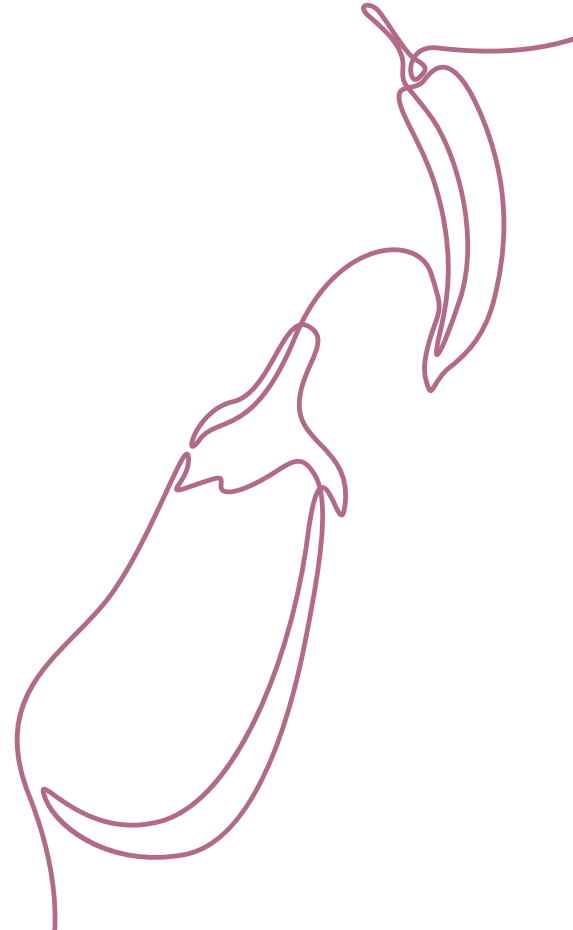

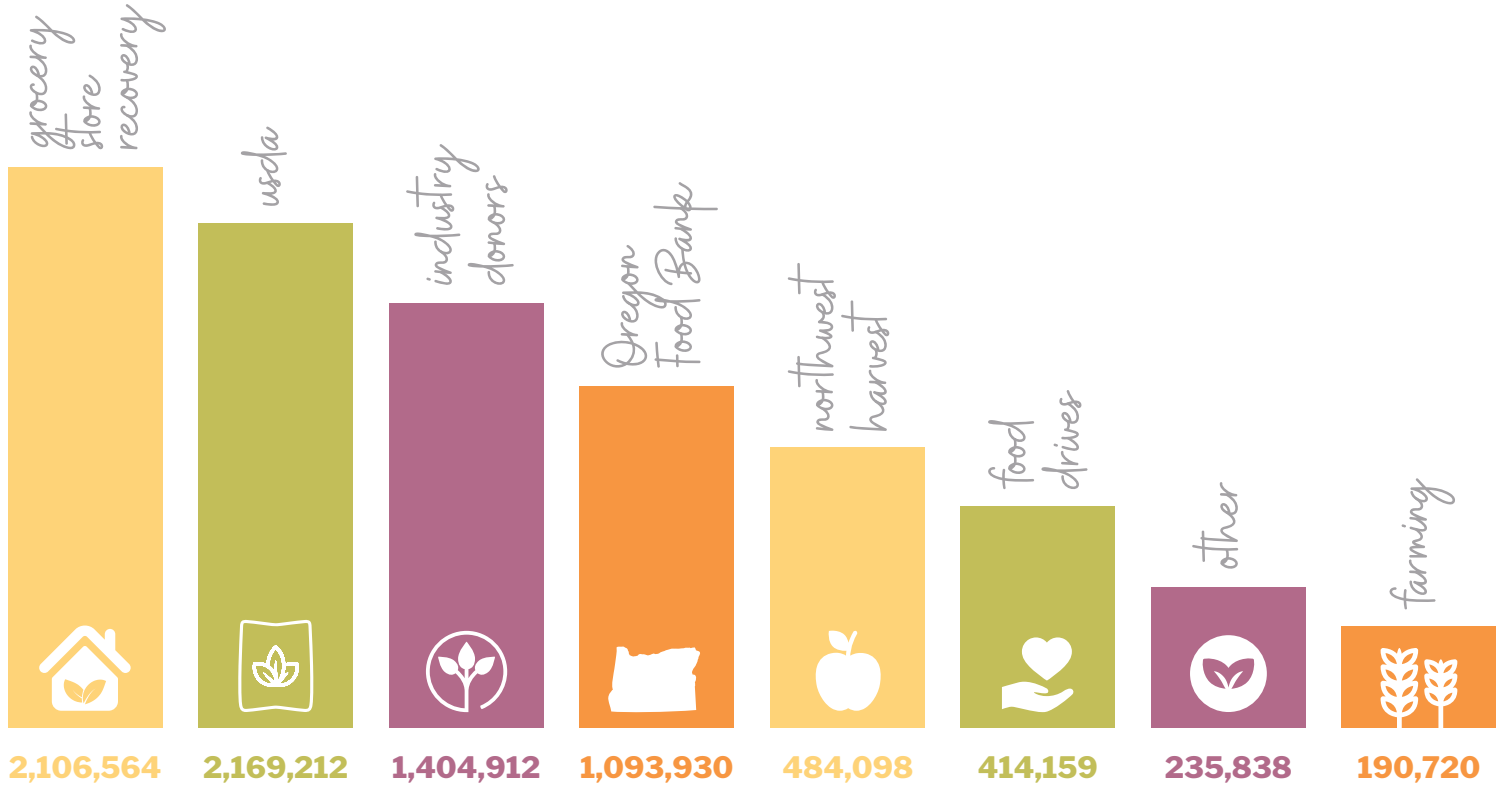
